Junior Curriculum Review

This has been an exciting journey with the review group visiting schools around New Zealand and attending conferences in New Zealand and overseas to build a vision for effective teaching and learning in years 9 and 10 at Glendowie College.

From their work, we have agreed on a vision for our junior curriculum and will begin planning for this in 2017. We will arrange meetings for interested parents in the first term of next year to explain our vision and discuss this with you.

House and Pastoral Review

Glendowie College is a close-knit community with strong, close relationships.

As our roll continues to grow, it is important that we evolve our pastoral support for students to ensure that we are doing the very best to support individual students pastorally and academically, and help them grow into superb young men and women.

To enable this, we will shift from year level Deans to Deans and Assistant Deans of vertical houses in 2018. This will enhance our pastoral care, and provide more leadership opportunities for students at all year levels, while retaining traditions such as whole-school assemblies and prefects. 2017 will be a year to plan for this transition.

Campus Vision

The Board of Trustees has now identified the building and property projects that it wants to achieve over the next five years, and is now working with a project management firm – Watershed – to turn this into a reality.

Unfortunately our planning for the new Science (and Somerville) block hit a few road-bumps and has been delayed in its implementation. While undesirable, the Board decided it is better to take our time and get a better finished product than to rush into a compromised design that will not meet the long-term needs of our community.

We will keep you updated about progress on this in 2017.

Good Samaritan – Paige Sturgess (Year 10 Student)

On Saturday 26th November 2016, Paige was competing in her second full Lake Taupo Cycle Challenge, a 160km circumnavigation of Lake Taupo. Paige had about 20km to go before the finish and was cycling up Hatape Hill. She got off her bike for a rest when another competitor fell off his bike right next to her. Paige initially thought he had mechanical issues with his bike, but he then went into anaphylactic shock. She put down her bike and went to his aid, others also stopped. Paige became the support person for the man as he was convulsing on the ground, and tried to keep him in the recovery position. She then called 111 and while she was still on the phone, the first responder arrived. She assisted the St John first responder with keeping the oxygen mask over the man's face while the ambulance crew where trying to set up an IV because the man kept fighting to take it off and dry heave. She stayed with him until he was on a bed and they said she could go.

For her effort, Paige was awarded the Fred Ogle Memorial Award, which is for an outstanding Good Samaritan act on the ride. Although this is a wonderful recognition of her kindness, it is a harsh reminder of the toll these ultra events put on some of the entrants.

The students organised the trip in advance as part of the planning phase and completed training days and a practice journey to prepare themselves for this adventure. The students had leadership roles in their 3 groups and displayed great team-work, resilience, self-reliance, determination, co-operation and initiative.

• Day one was a bit of a challenge with the 3 groups kayaking the 'Mad Mile' in strong winds and large swell, but all of the team eventually arrived at Anchorage Bay and after

some food reflected on what they had achieved that day.

- Day two the wind had died down and the group got to explore some of the lagoons and hear about the history of the area, the National Park and Maori myths along with appreciating the environment and the importance of protecting it.
- Day three had an early start (4am) to cross the Awaroa inlet and walk to scenic Mutton Cove. Along the track the groups sang songs, challenged each other with games and quizzes while enjoying the picturesque views, golden sandy beaches, rocky outcrops, vegetation and seeing the seal colony at Separation Point.
- Day four the students completed the walking phase to the end of the Coastal track at Wainui and then enjoyed a visit to Wainui Falls with some of them braving a dip in the cool freshwater pools.

The students had a wonderful time as did the 3 staff members Fiona Smith, Julie Barrack and George McKie. Chen Staff Scholarship


