Changes to the Bus Timetables

We are aware that the change of bus routes and times this term has had a number of problems including overcrowding, students not being picked up and buses not following the correct route. I have been in almost daily contact with Auckland Transport to relay these concerns and advocate for the service to be of an acceptable standard.

Auckland Transport planners met on Wednesday to resolve the issues they have been informed of. An initial response was that it was "a very good meeting" and they will provide feedback in due course. At the time of writing, no response had yet been received.

As soon as we receive any information, an email will be sent to parents. It is extremely unlikely that the buses will come at the later time on a Wednesday morning due to buses now servicing both Glendowie College and Sacred Heart College, which does not have a late start. The college library is open daily from 8:30am, so students can use that space prior to school starting on a Wednesday.

Community Consultation Process

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

Every four years, the Glendowie College Board of Trustees conducts a community consultation that feeds into its strategic planning cycle.

This year the Board has commissioned a research company – Buzz Channel – to undergo a research study in order to gain a better understanding of parents', students' and staff's experience of the school.

The aim of this initiative is to engage with our community – parents, students and staff members – to better understand how we are meeting your needs as well as what we can do to improve our services, systems, processes and communication.

We are excited about the engagement initiative and the insights it will deliver to help the school to better collaborate with the community and ensure students continue excelling and experiencing rich, varied and meaningful learning opportunities.

At the end of the strategic planning process, we will share with the insights we gain and the college's ongoing strategic development.

Who will be managing this engagement process?

Glendowie College has commissioned Buzz Channel, an independent specialist NZ research company to undertake this engagement project. Buzz Channel is a community engagement specialist with extensive experience in the education sector and evaluating feedback from students, parents and school stakeholders.

What is involved in this engagement initiative?

- Stage 1 Buzz Channel to conduct qualitative focus groups and/or workshops with parents, students, and staff members in the week commencing Monday, 20 August 2018. The aim of this stage is to explore the community's views on Glendowie College, what are the key strengths of the school, what are the areas that the school could improve upon and any suggestions or recommendations for continuous improvement.
- Stage 2 Buzz Channel to run online surveys with all parents, students, and staff members in the week commencing Monday, 10 September 2018. The aim of this stage is to apply findings and insights from the previous qualitative stage using an online survey to gather feedback from the entire community and obtain a detailed [representative] understanding of the community's feedback, concerns and views.
- **Stage 3** Buzz Channel to analyse all feedback to create a report around the key findings and recommendations from the community.
- Stage 4 Glendowie College Board of Trustees to consider the feedback of the community consultation and work with the college to develop its next four-year strategic plan. This will include sharing insights and strategic directions with parents and the wider community.

This engagement initiative will commence in August and will continue throughout August and September 2018.

As part of this engagement process, Buzz Channel will invite the Glendowie College community (parents, staff and students) to provide feedback by participating in the focus groups/workshops and also through the online survey. Accordingly, we would like to pass on your email contact details to Buzz Channel to ensure they can conduct their research objectively, accurately and independently.

As you are aware, Glendowie College takes privacy very seriously and Buzz Channel, a professional research business, takes participant privacy and security as seriously as we do.
