Station closures and changes for trains – 20 March 2023 to January 2024

The Rail Network Rebuild (RNR) is an upgrade of Auckland's rail network. When this work is finished and City Rail Link is open, Auckland will have more frequent, reliable trains and faster journeys.

RNR Stage 2 will run from 20 March 2023 until January 2024. During Stage 2:

- Sylvia Park, Panmure, Glen Innes, Meadowbank and Ōrākei stations will be closed
- Eastern Line trains will run between Manukau and Britomart at peak times using the Southern Line (via Newmarket)
- At off-peak times, Eastern Line trains will run between Manukau and Ōtāhuhu only
- Onehunga Line trains will run between Onehunga and Penrose only at peak times
- At off-peak times, Onehunga Line trains will run between Onehunga and Britomart.

Getting to and from Glen Innes Station from 20 March 2023 until January 2024
