Dear Parents,

This year is now well under way with a great start last week. My thanks to the staff and students involved in the Pōwhiri which welcomed our year 9 students, as well as other students and staff to the school. It was especially nice to have three of our senior students speak.



I look forward to meeting with the parents of year 9

students on the evening of Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February. This is a chance for year 9 parents to learn more about the school, as well as to meet your child's Dean and Form Teacher.

Yet again, our school roll has increased and we are now approaching 1,200 domestic students at the school. This reflects the continued population growth in our area (and across Auckland generally) and demand to gain a place in our college.

The first six weeks of this term are very busy with many events, such as Athletics Day, Swimming Sports, Summerfest, and various trips and camps, especially the new Year 9 camps. I encourage you to bookmark the school calendar on the website. You can also access the school notices via the 'Parent Portal' from our school website.

We still await the formal NCEA results from NZQA, however, preliminary highlights include 96% of year 12 students achieving Level 2 NCEA, and 80% of our year 11 students gaining Level 1 NCEA endorsed with either merit or excellence. These are both our highest ever at Levels 1 and 2, and place Glendowie College among the top schools in New Zealand. They reflect the calibre of our students and their hard work in 2017, as well as the excellent work of staff at the college.

# Parent / Student / Form Teacher Conferencing

Parent/Student/Form Teacher Conferencing will be held at the school on Tuesday 27 February 2018 from 2.45pm to 5.00pm and Wednesday 28 February 2018 from 8.45am to 4.00pm.

# Students are required to accompany their parents/caregivers to the interview. They must be in full school uniform.

As the interviews are about their academic progress, it is important that they are part of the discussion and have a clear understanding of their progress to date and future priorities. *Please note that the interviews will take place with EACH student regardless of whether or not a parent/caregiver is present. Form teachers will let these students know of their interview times.* 

The interviews will be conducted in your child's form room and will be of 15 minutes duration. Your child can help direct you to the relevant room and there will also be staff and prefects to assist you.

- Subject Teachers are not available for these interviews. There will be the opportunity to discuss subject specific progress at the mid-year Parent/Teacher Interviews or by arrangements organised through the Form Teacher.
- School will finish at 1.40pm on Tuesday 27 February 2018. It will be arranged for buses to be on time for the early finish.
- Classes will not run on Wednesday 28 February 2018.

#### To book Parent/Student/Form Teacher conferencing appointments:

- 1. The booking site will be open from 10am Monday 19 February 2018.
- 2. Go to www.schoolinterviews.co.nz
- 3. Input the school's unique code **dxvdn** on the Home Page, then follow the instructions.

#### Please note:

- There will be a few computers made available at school to students who might not have internet access at home. They can use them to make appointments.
- You can print your appointment sheets.
- You can go back and edit appointments later.
- When making appointments with other people listed as well as the Form Teacher, it is advisable to have a gap between appointments to facilitate the movement between rooms.
- The booking website will be closed at 9am on Tuesday 27 February 2018 for the interviews. This is necessary
  for the teachers to prepare for interviews and to schedule time slots with students who do not have an
  interview time.

#### **Corrections to School Bus Information**

There has been a mismatch between the information provided by the college and that provided by Auckland Transport as to which buses serve Glendowie College. The following corrections have been made to the school website and need to be made in the Student Planner each student has.

The morning 359 route from Otahuhu no longer runs. Students need to use the 757 public bus which stops at the Mt Taylor Drive entrance to the college.

The afternoon 527 bus to Otahuhu has been replaced by the 027 which follows the same route departing from the college. Alternatively, students can take the public 757 bus which leaves from Mt Taylor Drive.

We sincerely apologize for any confusion this has caused.

### Music Lessons offered at Glendowie College

Performance music is an extremely strong area of learning at Glendowie, and we are fortunate to have a team of highly skilled teachers who work with our students through the itinerant music programme. We offer tuition in a wide range of instruments, including voice, except piano and keyboard. Many Year 9 students have already signed up for instruments, but it is not too late for others to join.

Lessons are weekly, held during school time, 30 minutes in length and rotate with the 6-day timetable, so students do not miss the same part of a lesson each week.

#### Hands on at Otago



Earlier this year, I had the opportunity to fly down to Dunedin to experience university life at the University of Otago. I was one of 400 students from all over New Zealand who applied and were selected for this program.

The program was six days long, and it included a variety of extra activities and courses called snacks. My snacks included Maori studies, Psychology and Otago Museum preparation. In our free time, we were also free to explore the town.

We started the physics project with an ice-

breaker activity of making solar powered grasshoppers that led onto our first topic which was on light and waves. We got to use a pyranometer and pyrgeometer which measure visible light and infrared light and took them out to MacAndrew Bay to do some real life measuring comparing ice, water and land surfaces' reflectance of light. In more scientific words, we were investigating the radiation balance over several surfaces using a pyranometer.

Leading off the ice surface in the previous experiment, we went to see the ice lab. One of the rooms was -3 degrees where we saw super-cooling in action and the other was -21 degrees where we made some designs using water and then saw them through polarized light (turning this created a different image; one invisible one that looked like it was 3D).



The day after that we processed data and went onto sound waves. We also made a wave machine to help demonstrate sound waves. We were fortunate enough to see the atom manipulation



and interferometry lab which worked with lasers to capture pictures of atoms.

Overall it was a very enjoyable experience, and I recommend others apply for this program, so they can learn more about their possible future degree.

# **AUT Roy Geddes Science Education Award**



Huge congratulations to Alvaro Nola-Dodd (Year 13) for receiving the AUT Roy Geddes Science Education Award. This provided travel to London to attend the prestigious London International Youth Science Forum. He was one of the two Roy Geddes awardees, selected by Rotary clubs throughout NZ, from among 174 high-achieving science students.

Alvaro was nominated by the school to participate in the 2018 National Rotary Science & Technology Forum, held in Auckland 14-27 Jan. This is what he had to say about his experience:

"In January, I attended the Rotary National Youth Science and Technology forum in Auckland along with almost 200 like-minded students from around the country, partaking in two weeks of science modules and activities. The modules and lectures gave all students a great insight into the world of science across all the various disciplines. In just two weeks, everyone went from being complete strangers to lifelong friends, and everyone would agree that it was an invaluable experience that left us changed. I, along with another student, was awarded the AUT University Roy Geddes Science Education Award to attend the London International Youth



Science Forum in July this year with around 500 top students from around the world. I would like to thank Rotary St. Johns, who sponsored me for the forum, and everyone else involved, including all the lecturers and universities for giving their time to run the modules with us, and especially the Forum Director, Darryn Wells, for making the forum a realistic and an unforgettable experience for all involved."








#### **Parent and Student Portal**
