


New Internet Access Requirements for BYOD

The school's Internet service provider (N4L) has recently upgraded the school's router and installed a new firewall. Part of this process requires a SSL certificate to be installed on all devices that access the school's internet connection. The purpose of this requirement is to allow inspection of selected encrypted web traffic to keep users safe from otherwise hidden threats. The SSL certificate is only active while the device is being used on the school network. N4L's Web Filtering presents the SSL certificate to the end user device while inspecting traffic only, the certificate is not used in any other situation.






Glendowie College Alumni Upcoming Events - Please spread the word!

Glendowie College has two YES groups, 'Jandalisation' and 'CloudMass', in the competition this year.

CloudMass is a business run by myself as the CEO, Matthew Bilby (12TBS) as the CMO and Adam Jonkers (12SRM) as the CFO. The Young Enterprise Trust occasionally runs domestic and international trips for YES participants to travel and compete business challenges with all expenses covered. Matthew Bilby, CMO of CloudMass, was fortunate to be selected from over 4000 participants across New Zealand for this trip. This is a great opportunity to experience cultural immersion, with new languages and a new take on international business. I was fortunate to be one of the successful candidates out of over 100 applications. I will fly out in the second week of the July holidays and travel to Buenos Aires. During the week, I will compete with seven other New Zealand YES students and the local Argentinian students. I am really looking forward to seeing Argentina's take on business internationally, and for the opportunity to increase my business networks.



COURSE OUTLINE

Gwendoline is a clinical psychologist specialising in depression and anxiety. Her workshops address supporting youth resilience to deal with problems that result from growing up in a rapidly changing world.

The initial part of the session will be an introduction to the science of anxiety and the basic theory of the CBT methodology. Participants will be provided with a toolkit of cognitive skills, applicable and user-friendly, that could be shared with teenagers to enable them to manage the spontaneous and overwhelming emotional outpouring. Gwendoline also explores the concept of entitlement, what it looks like and what has contributed to it. She will explore the notion of helicopter parenting and the long term impact of this on youth.

Gwendoline is a psychologist, speaker and writer. In her clinical consulting practice, she works mostly with adults and young adults and their associated anxieties. Gwendoline is the author of several books. Her latest, Knowing, provides numerous preventative and remedial strategies aimed at young people who are experiencing difficulties in life.
