Yesterday, our teaching staff participated in a Teacher Only Day. The focus of this day was to finish planning for the full MYP programme in year 10 next year. After a session together discussing some of the 'Approaches to Learning', staff went to their faculties to collaborate on their year 10 units.

I am very excited about the MYP programme. We have had a range of feedback from students, parents and teachers. Students have expressed how they enjoy having a wider choice in their subjects, working in groups and being challenged to work at a high level.

Next year, the IB organisation will send staff to the school on a 'pre-authorisation' visit that ensures we meet the international expectations for IB schools. This is one of the key reasons we chose the IB MYP framework, i.e. it has rigour and accountability.

We are heading into the final two weeks of the year. I look forward to the Leavers' Dinner on Wednesday 4 December and the Junior Prizegiving on Thursday 5 December.




