Middle Years Programme (MYP) Accreditation

In the last week of lockdown 2, the college underwent a comprehensive review by the International Baccalaureate (IB) organisation to determine whether the college was ready to be authorised as an IB school. The level of investigation was on a par with an ERO review. The review concluded that the college was ready for authorisation and the report was glowing in terms of the level of preparation and the quality of the programmes being provided to the Year 9 and 10 students. Below are some comments from the report.

"The school's vision succinctly aligns with all key components of the IB Mission and philosophy."

"The language policy takes into account the learning of both English and Te Reo Maori....The school is recommended to share this approach with international schools as a model for embracing both English and the language of the host country."

"The (Special Educational Needs) team and other faculty members were able to give detailed descriptions of the extensive support provided over extended periods of time to their students in order to support meaningful inclusion."

"The high quality of the work produced by teachers is evidence of their planning expertise."

"A picture has been painted whereby collaborative planning is a natural part of professional relationships at the school."

"The school has developed exemplary meaningful experiences for the students through a carefully thought out collection of units. The units reflected that diverse teaching practices had to be in place for them to be enacted."

I am very proud of the staff we have at Glendowie College. This report from an independent international reviewer shows the high quality of the teachers and the learning programmes they are producing. The purpose of the MYP programme is to develop a programme that is relevant and engaging for students and authentic to New Zealand and Glendowie. We want our junior students to have the skills and attributes to be better prepared for the senior school and to have success in NCEA. Faculties will be refining the MYP programme further in 2021 and the same quality planning will be in place to develop the Year 11 programme next year.

A huge amount of work has been undertaken by all staff, but Mrs Hewetson, who has overseen the development of the MYP programme, the MYP coordinators and the Faculty Heads should especially be recognised.

Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews and Senior Exams

A big thank you to the parents/caregivers and students who attended the Year 11-13 Zoom interviews. Despite some technical glitches, the consensus was that the interviews were a success and that the Zoom format is worth considering for the future. We will survey a cross-section of parents about this.

The focus of the interviews was preparation for the end of the year school exams and further to those the NCEA exams. The possibility of having to use derived grades if the NCEA exams are impacted by Covid-19 means that the school exams have become more important. As stated at the beginning of the newsletter, while it is important to have a break, senior students must plan to undertake revision during the holidays to be ready for school exams in the first week back.

Proposed 2020 Year 11 Glendowie Certificate

In May after the first lockdown, it was proposed that Glendowie College would offer its own Year 11 certificate due to the disruption in learning. Students who gained 60 Level 1 credits or were endorsed at merit and/or excellence with 40 credits would gain the Glendowie Year 11 certificate.

However, NCEA have altered the number of credits required to gain Level 1, merit and excellence endorsements. NZQA now offer up to 16 Learning Recognition credits which effectively means students need to attain 64 credits to gain Level 1. Likewise, level endorsements have been reduced from 50 to 44 credits.

As these reductions make the NCEA Level 1 credit boundaries very similar to the ones proposed by the college in May, we have decided not to proceed with the 2020 Year 11 Glendowie Certificate as few, if any, students will be affected.

Board of Trustees Update

The Board of Trustees was delighted with the recent review of Glendowie College's Middle Years Programme by the International Baccalaureate organisation. The school has implemented the programme to a very high standard, and our junior students are, and will be, benefitting from the programme. Our thanks to Mrs Sharon Hewetson for leading the development and implementation of MYP, and to all staff for supporting the initiative.

On the property front, we have seen good progress of our projects: the science block is still on track for completion early in the new year; the design of the new Learning Centre has been completed, with costings the next step in converting the Hammer Block into a centralised hub for a variety of student support services; and the new cricket nets will be completed in time for this summer's cricket season. Thankfully these projects were able to progress under Auckland's Level 3 lockdown conditions. Our thanks to the Parents' Association and especially to the Hollister family for their great work in re-planting parts of the quad.

The Board of Trustees is mindful of the negative impact that Covid-19 induced lockdowns have had on Glendowie College's finances. The loss of most of our international students has created a financial hole. The Board has put on hold the next rounds of strategic projects until there is more certainty in the school's finances. We are grateful to the parents and families who have paid the school donation this year. Donations received are down on the same time last year, but not down as much as we expected. Your donation enables the school to keep providing the resources and experiences that all of our students benefit from.

At our recent September Board meeting, we welcomed Jono Sayal, who is the newly elected student representative on the Board. At the same time, we farewelled Laura Oh who has represented GDC students for the past year. Laura has performed brilliantly as a trustee, and when she runs for Prime Minister one day, she will have my vote!

We wish all of our senior students well with their upcoming exams, and thank our staff for their amazing support of our students.

1970's Decade Reunion – 7 November 2020 (Saturday)




The 70's Decade Reunion has been rescheduled to Saturday 7 November 2020. Numbers are restricted to 100 people at level 2 and there are a few spaces left.

Cellphone-Free Policy

Glendowie College introduced a cellphone-free policy in Term 4 2019 for junior students and for the whole school from the start of Term 1 2020. The reason for this is that while cellphones have many positive uses, there are also negative effects of over or inappropriate use.

The college has found that as a result of being cellphone free during the school day, students are more engaged in their learning and more physically and socially active at break times. It also gives students time and space from their cellphones as they are not as preoccupied with them.

The college is maintaining its cellphone-free policy. Students are able to have a cellphone in their bag, but may not use it at school (in or out of class) between 8.00am and 3.20pm.

If a student does not comply with this policy and has the phone confiscated, then it is returned to the student by the Deputy Principal in charge of the student's house at the end of the day. If there are subsequent confiscations, then the student may receive detentions, parents are informed and the length of time the phone is confiscated for increases. If there is an ongoing persistent problem, then it may be considered as continual disobedience.

As a college, we would prefer to work with students and parents in a positive collaborative manner rather than having punitive measures in place. However, to maintain a cellphone free environment, clear consequences are needed to ensure that students will comply. Being cellphone-free during the school day has been proven through research to have a positive effect on learning and student wellbeing. Parental support in this matter is greatly appreciated.

If parents need to contact their children during the day, they can either email them using the student's school email address or leave a message at either Reception or Student Services that will be delivered to the student.

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh – 2020 Year 10 Students

With the changing Covid-19 situation, the Duke of Edinburgh's Head Office are allowing the adaptations to the Award as outlined on their [website](#) until 31 December 2020. They recognise that the impact of Covid-19 is significant for many participants and are continuing to be flexible, so that everyone can continue with their Award in creative ways, keeping their progress on track.

Glendowie College would prefer that students continue to complete the Bronze Award by signing up to the 'Qualifying Journey' as planned with Bigfoot Adventures.

Option 1

31 October/1 November 2020 Karangahake Gorge (transport included - \$210.00)

Option 2

7/8 November 2020 Karangahake Gorge (transport included - \$210.00)

Students who were booked for the 'Qualifying Journey' over Labour Weekend (24/25 October) should contact Chelle at Bigfoot Adventures directly on doe@bigfootadventures.co.nz to change to one of the above options.

However, if neither of the above options are suitable, Bigfoot Adventures are offering students the opportunity to complete the Award by taking part in a single day of 'Qualifying Assessments'. This will be held on Saturday 21 November, from 9am to 4:30pm, at a regional park location which will be confirmed. This will cost \$105.00 per person. Transport is not included for programmes within Auckland. Participants on this day will be expected to be well prepared to demonstrate all the skills expected at 'Qualifying'. Please note it is recommended that students who wish to progress to Silver complete the full 'Qualifying Journey', otherwise a number of participants will not have done any overnight tramping, which involves 3 days and 2 overnights for both Practice and Qualifying, within the Award programme prior to Silver.

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh – 2020 Year 9 Students

Any students who are in Year 9 and who turn 14 before 31 December 2020 can sign up to the Bronze Award this year and begin their 'Skills, Physical Recreation and Service' sections. Students can sign up to the 'Online Record Book'. Both practice tramps and qualifying tramps will take place next year (2021) when all participants, including students in their year group who do not turn 14 until next year, are in Year 10. The dates for the training and practice tramps are as follows:

Option 1

3-5 April 2021 Training and Practice combo journey at Northern Kaimais and Karangahake Gorge (the same journey advertised by Bigfoot Adventures in the earlier meeting this year, involving off track navigation and 2 nights away for the price of 1) - \$300.00

We are also so proud of our brave Year 9 team who did so well on behalf of the school after engaging with the language for only 6 months.



Gold CREST Programme



The CREST programme, run by the Royal Society of New Zealand, is an internationally recognised programme that aims to progress the development of an inquiry culture, particularly in the subject areas of Science and Technology (incorporating Engineering). Gold CREST requires students to expand their knowledge of specific techniques, language and to analyse methods used in their area of research.

Student achievement is assessed on creativity, perseverance and the application of knowledge.

Gold CREST is a major step-up from the Silver CREST Programme. We were fortunate to be selected as one of two teams admitted into the Gold CREST 2020 national level. Our Gold CREST project is a Virtual Reality driving simulator aimed at teenagers and those who are trying to get their learners licence.

Attending seminars hosted by the Gold CREST organisers is proving to be a very challenging but fulfilling experience. As we were challenged to produce work of great calibre, this programme has allowed us to develop our technical and report writing skills. We found the programme very rewarding as it helped us to obtain a wide range of skills including working with external IT consultants and stakeholders. This week, we had our progress meeting with our CREST advisor, Carol Pound, and consultant, Nishal Thomas, to get productive feedback on our journey. 




Te Rātaka a Tētahi Kohine – The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank

They are the publisher and distributor of 'Te Rātaka a Tētahi Kohine' – 'The Diary of a Young Girl' by Anne Frank in Te Reo Māori in 2019. As part of Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, the Holocaust Centre has provided Glendowie College with a complimentary copy of this taonga.

Anne's experiences and thoughts during that terrible time in world history are poignant and relevant for the world we live in today. Anne was optimistic – "in spite of everything I still believe that people are really good at heart."



Tēnā koutou, ko Melisa Chase tōku ingoa. Nō te uri o Tuwharetoa me te waka o Tainui ahau. Ko au te pou whakaako reo Māori ki tēnei kura. Nōku te waimārie, nōku te māhaki ki te tū mai ai.

I feel fortunate and humbled to be part of the Glendowie whānau as the Te Reo Māori teacher.

I love having books around me, and I am constantly adding to our Te Reo Māori collection each year. I believe in the power of having good literature in a space designed for learning, so we now have a variety of dictionaries, and some language learning books. Adding to that, a range of free journals written for primary schools. So, let's be frank here, there has been a scarcity of great resources and literature available in Te Reo Māori across Aotearoa, leaving Te Reo Māori speakers unable to experience a vast range of rich global literature in our chosen language. Therefore, this pukapuka and books like this (Hare Pota me te Whatu Manapou – Harry Potter & the Philosopher's Stone) are **taonga** (precious). Having this beauty in my classroom (I'll be honest, it'll probably live more at my home) makes my heart soar, nō reira, ngā mihi nunui ki te Holocaust Centre for your koha to our college. An old whakataukī/proverb describes how I feel perfectly:

Ahakoā he iti, he pounamu

although it is small, the value is most precious
