Since the last newsletter, we have had Year 12 and 13 go on their study leave and start NCEA exams, Year 11 exams and Year 9 and 10 students return to school.

Parents of Year 12 and 13 students have probably had conversations with their children about 'Unexpected Event Grades' and the implication as to whether they need to sit exams. NZQA's intention was to give students the



opportunity to still gain credits even if they were unable to sit exams. The reality is that the UEGs became a guaranteed minimum grade a student could attain for that standard. As a result, some students are picking which standards and subjects they want to improve their grades in and are attending only those exams. This is an anomoly for this year only and the UEG option reflects the difficulty some students faced trying to learn during lockdown. While UEGs have worked to the advantage of a lot of our students, in many Auckland schools they were necessary to measure the true ability of students affected.

It was great to see the high attendance rates for Year 9 and 10 returning to school. While there was some trepidation about students returning, in hindsight it has been the right call. There is a positive feeling around school. Students seem to want to be here and enjoy talking with their friends and being active at interval and lunchtime. Learning in class is so much easier than by Zoom. Getting the students back into the habit of being at school will make it so much easier for the start of next year.

Relating this to student wellbeing, the R.I.C.H framework comes to mind. C stands for Challenge. Our students have made it through the challenge of lockdown with its impact on their learning and the bulk have overcome that challenge well. H is for Hope. Looking into the future the seniors are on track to pursue their academic and career pathways while those returning know that school will be a safe and positive place to be. We have a lot to look forward to.

Congratulations to the recipients of the major awards in last week's Prizegiving. Special mention must be made of our Dux, Joshua Lay. Not only was he the top academic student but was also the Head Boy, was awarded leadership and sports trophies and gained a major Scholarship from the University of Auckland. All thoroughly deserved.

Year 13 have had their final day at school as a whole group. I do empathise with them as they did not have the opportunities other years have had to be involved in activities special to them. I do hope they look back on the past five years with affection. They have come a long way from those fresh-faced Year 9s at the start of 2017.

The Board met on Wednesday night, again unfortunately but unavoidably via Zoom, rather than in person.

Our main observation is how great it is for students to be back at College. Admittedly it's not back to "normal", but crucial for our students to re-make social connections and take up the learning opportunities while they can. Our appreciation goes out to all staff and students who have returned so positively.

The Board would like to congratulate the Principal, Gordon Robertson, on his appointment as the Lead Principal of the Glendowie Kāhui Ako, or Community of Learning. With his strong links to this community, we are confident he will lead the Kāhui Ako ably, while continuing to successfully fulfil the Principal role for the College.

As this is the last Board update for the year, we did look back on another very eventful year. Despite the challenges and disruptions caused by COVID, 2021 has been a year of significant achievement for Glendowie College, including:

- The amazing Science block/Dykes building became operational and was formally opened by Chris Hipkins, the Minister of Education. This is the culmination of many years' work and struggle to get the modern, high-quality building we are now proud to have;
- We received accreditation as an 'International Baccalaureate' World School for our Middle Years
  Programme, the only state school in New Zealand to achieve this. Again, this is a testament to many years'
  hard work and determination;
- The Year 11 programme is fully in place, with this being the first time Year 11 students have not taken NCEA level 1, instead following our own learning and assessment programme;
- Arts, sports and service programmes have been maintained despite the disruptions, with a highlight being the musical production, 'Bye Bye Birdie';
- Academic results (NCEA levels 2 and 3) appear on track to match prior years' impressive levels.

There are too many people to thank individually for these, and many, many more achievements not mentioned above. The Board extend our thanks and admiration to all students, staff and parents who have contributed so much to the year.
